Curriculum Development

ART 410/510, History of Art and Social Practice 1920–Now

Developed this course as an undergraduate and graduate offering at PSU. This course traces a history of social practice in art and investigate the current critiques, debates and issues surrounding its current state in relation to its historical context. This course places a strong emphasis on contemporary examples of social practice art through readings, assignments, and online participation. This course gives a historic and critical context for which students can situate their practices.

Selected Courses Taught

University of Illinois at Chicago-ART 101, Signifying Practices: Introduction to Art Making and Critical Thinking

The purpose of this class is to prepare you to be an interesting, knowledgeable and productive artist citizen (culture maker) in the 21 century. This course is designed as an introduction to theoretical perspectives from many fields and discourses, now often grouped under the heading Visual Culture studies. We will become a community of learners in which each of you will develop the knowledge, perspectives and skills that will support your unique artistic/culture making practices. You will work on evolving a personal writing style that will be useful as you develop yourself as an artist/citizen/intellectual—supporting your thinking/research/making as well as your ability to explain and promote your work.

Carnegie Mellon University- Art in Everyday Life

Art in Everyday Life traces the social and historical influences that have informed artists whose work sought to connect art and life. Students in the course will identify areas of their own life that will become the site of their work as artists.

This course will examine the ways that art movements ranging from Dada, Neo-Concretism, the Situationist International, social sculpture, social/public/contextual practice have all tried to bring art and life in close proximity. In addition the course will examine in a parallel fashion the social movements, cultural theory, and philosophies that were influencing these artists from political activism, intentional living, and Eastern philosophies.

This class will highlight a selection of artists who connect their artistic practice to their life values and philosophies. Students will be challenged to connect their beliefs, philosophies, and daily living directly to their work as artists.

Portland State University-ART 583, Graduate Seminar: Practice and Pedagogy

Explores teaching at local and national institutions as preparation for teaching in higher education. This seminar includes curriculum development, syllabi development, assessment and educational objectives viewed through the lens of issues in contemporary art education and visual culture. ART 582 Graduate Research and Writing Seminar Explores the role of writing and research in socially engaged art practices. The course considers the importance of writing in communicating projects that are ephemeral, situation based, time based, and collaborative.

Portland State University-ART 481/581 Museum History Seminar

Co-Taught with Mark Dion

The Museum Museum Seminar is a nimble idiosyncratic investigation into those marvelous institutions mandated to expand knowledge through encounters with things. Participants will first become acquainted with origins of museums in the form of curiosity cabinets of the 16th and 17th centuries and then move on to explore the universal museums of the enlightenment followed by the disciplined collections of modern museums.

Portland State University-ART 300 Professional Practices

Explores various topics in contemporary art, concentrating on specific issues of professional development for undergraduate students. Through lectures, research, reading and writing, a variety of tools and strategies directly related to contemporary art world practices will be taught.

University Studies Senior Capstone: Art as a Force for Social Change

What can art do? This course will examine the potential that creative acts have to effect social, political, local and personal change through the social application of art in the context of an arts program geared towards homeless and transitional populations.
